

Jail Visit Policy

- *All visits are on Saturday from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM and are for up to 30 minutes each.*
- *Visits must be scheduled 24 hours in advance of visitation day starting (by 9:00 AM) on Friday in order for the screening process to be completed for the Saturday visit.*
- *Visitors may only visit one inmate once per week.*
- *Inmates may only have one visit per week.*
- *All visitors must be 17 years of age or older to visit; otherwise accompanied by a parent/ Legal Guardian.*
- *No more than three adult people, not counting minor children, per visitation time slot.*
- *Visitors who have been in Jail in the past 90 days will not be allowed to visit.*
- *Visitors on Probation or Parole must have written approval from his/her P & P Officer **prior to** visiting.*
- *All adult visitors must have a photo ID in their possession at the time of the visit.*
- *All other property on the visiting person must not be brought past the lobby door. Only automobile keys and a photo ID will be allowed past the lobby door.*
- *Visitors with restraining orders involving an inmate or listed as no contact bond conditions will not be allowed to visit said inmate.*

DENIAL OR TERMINATION OF A VISIT:

- A. A visit may be denied or terminated and visiting privileges suspended under any of the following circumstances.
- **Failure of the visitor to show up at the scheduled time of the visit.**
 - **Introduction or attempted introduction of contraband into a jail facility. (May result in charges.)**
 - Visitor(s) that appear to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
 - An Inmate can request at anytime not to visit person(s) signed up to visit.
 - Insufficient space available.
 - Refusal by a visitor to submit to search procedures.
 - Refusal or failure to produce sufficient identification (ordinarily picture ID) or the falsifying of identifying information by a visitor.
 - Failure to prevent children from disturbing others.
 - Inappropriate display of affection, suggestive activity, or inappropriate dress.
 - A visitor with visible body markings or jewelry that by its nature would promote or cause adversarial reactions because of racial, ethnic, or religious beliefs will not be permitted to remain in the Jail's general public area, inside or outside of the Jail.
 - Dress that excites the senses; transparent clothing, exposed breasts, exposed genitalia is not appropriate and not allowed for visitors. Short shorts and tank tops (male and female), and/or bare feet are not considered appropriate dress for a Jail setting.
 - Other conduct or conditions deemed by the Jail Supervisor/Administrator as disruptive to the security or orderly operation of the visitation process.
- B. Repeated violations of any of the above standards may result in the denial of visiting for an extended period of time.
- C. **Special Visits may be scheduled by DFS, P & P, clergy, and/or an attorney.**
